Intel Volunteers Beautify Five Hillsboro Schools in Large Single-Day Effort

More than 400 employees from the Product Development Group to assist schools through project completion and Intel's volunteer matching grants

August 5, 2015, Hillsboro, OR – Five Hillsboro schools: Hillsboro High School, South Meadows Middle School, and Butternut Creek, W.L. Henry, and Witch Hazel Elementary Schools will benefit from the Intel Product Development Group's (PDG) Global Day of Service on Wednesday, August 5, when more than 400 volunteers from the group will complete a variety of projects on their campuses.

Intel has a long history of service and partnership with the Hillsboro School District. Through its volunteer matching grant program, in which non-profit organizations are eligible to receive \$10 per hour of Intel employee volunteer time provided a 20-hour threshold is met, the company has donated millions of dollars to Hillsboro schools. In 2014, Intel employees and retirees volunteer over 20,100 hours at Hillsboro schools, clubs, and athletic programs, which resulted in nearly \$201,000 in matching grants.

On Wednesday, August 5, 2015, volunteers will spend six hours (9 a.m. to 3 p.m. with lunch from 12 to 12:30 p.m.) at the schools sites completing the following projects:

- Hillsboro High School (Hilhi) – 125 volunteers – Power washing, painting benches and PE building, cleaning out the shed behind the auto shop, landscaping the friendship garden, and spreading bark dust.
- South Meadows Middle School – 82 volunteers – Inside window cleaning, outside landscaping, spreading bark dust, bark chipping the butterfly garden, and weeding the courtyard.
- Butternut Creek Elementary School – 62 volunteers – Inside window cleaning, painting the kitchen and touching up hallways, landscaping around the school and down by Butternut Creek, and spreading bark dust.
- W.L. Henry Elementary School – 87 volunteers – Power washing, window washing, painting the front office and health room, outside landscaping, and spreading bark dust.
- Witch Hazel Elementary School – 71 volunteers – Inside window cleaning, outside landscaping, spreading bark dust, and bark chipping the butterfly garden.

Media are welcome and invited to attend the worksites to take pictures and talk to volunteers.
