

## Evergreen Parent Club Meeting Minutes – Sept. 12, 2011

### Secretary's Report – Anita

- Meeting minutes will be posted on the Parent Club page of the Evergreen website by Friday. You can always check there to see what happened, if you miss a meeting.
- I will send out email reminders of events or sign-ups for volunteers for events.

### Treasurer's Report – Debbie

- Chitra will be our treasurer this year. Debbie is here today to help with the transition. Debbie took us through the budget and actual for the past 2 years. This should help us in determining a budget for this year.
- The Student Store had been a huge money maker in the past (selling lots of candy), but since the nutritional guidelines were adopted in 2009 we have had to change our inventory. Also, last year BOSS Bucks were no longer reimbursed. So, any profit we made off the cash sales went to fund the BOSS Bucks. We basically broke even last year. However, our club was happy to do it to support the PBIS program.
- So, we do need to raise money somehow. Shena discussed some fundraisers she has in mind: 2 Skateworld dates, selling Cookie Dough, a check writing campaign in Feb (at tax time), and selling discount cards. Maryann brought up the idea of Safeway escript. She will look into that before the next meeting. Vici will get more information on a possible kick-back from Lakeview Farms Pumpkin Patch (the owners have an 8<sup>th</sup> grader at Evergreen).
- After some budget discussion, it was decided that we would come up with budget dollar amounts at the next meeting. Debbie asked everyone to come prepared with a list of priorities of what we would like put funds toward this year. Shena pointed out that it depends on how much money we can raise. We voted to move forward with the fundraisers.

### Student Store report – Chris

- The store will open October 4. It will be open 3 days a week (Tu, Thurs, Fri) at lunch.
- Chris is coming up with ideas for different things to sell to hopefully make the store more interesting for the kids and more profitable. Chris will do the food purchasing, and Julie C. has agreed to help with the purchasing of non-food items.
- Vici will coordinate the volunteers. She passed around a sign-up sheet for October and November. The lunch times are different this year, so Anita will look up when volunteers should be there each day.

### Principal's report – Rian

- This year the school district has had to make \$18 million in cuts. Evergreen has lost 2.4 teachers with the same number of students (830 kids). There are now 3.5 more students per class. The average core class size is 35 students. With all the budget cuts we really need volunteers to help engage the students. Parents are welcome anytime to observe, hang out. Let the office know ahead of time when you plan to come. Volunteers also needed to help with kids, or do an after school club.
- After school programs – the Zone (through Parks & Rec) – will have a web design class, a running club, a weightlifting club and more.
- AmeriCorps teacher – we pay half of his salary. He is a full-time employee, focusing this year on working with the math dept. He will need parent volunteers – see his table at Back to School night.
- Back to School Nights will be Sept 13 (7<sup>th</sup> grade) and Sept 15 (8<sup>th</sup>), 7:00pm.
- Evergreen website – [www.hsd.k12.or.us/evergreen](http://www.hsd.k12.or.us/evergreen) - daily announcements are posted there every day. Check it often to find out what's going on at school.
- District wide change to grading policy – kids will be graded 90% on assessments (papers, tests, speech, portfolio, etc.), and 10% on daily assignments, homework. See the district website for more detailed information.
- PBIS – Positive Behavior Intervention Support – Staff volunteers work to support this and keep it going. Staff raises money for this program with Mr. Waterman's magic show and part of the magazine sale profits.

Rian outlined 2 things he would like from the parent club:

1. Providing technology for the teachers to use in the class – ELMOs, audio amplifiers, etc.
2. Anything we can do to help with staff morale – lunches, dinner on conference night, etc.

#### **Volunteer opportunities-Anita**

- Back to school nights – need 2 parents to man the parent club table. 8<sup>th</sup> grade parents on Tues: Anita and Karen; 7<sup>th</sup> grade parents on Thurs: Chitra and Becky.
- Magazine sale turn-in days – Anita passed around a sign- up sheet. 6-8 parents are needed each day – Sept 27, Sept 30 and Oct 4 – from 8 to 11am.

### Treasurer's Report – Chitra

- Started Sept 1, 2011 with \$2889 in the bank. We made \$70 at Back to School Night selling lanyards.

Technology : Mr. Petrick would like to have ELMO document cameras in each classroom (they are \$600 each). Some classrooms already have them, but if Parent Club could help with that he would be grateful. Also, audio systems would be useful for teachers, too.

Some money-making ideas were discussed:

1. Target, Safeway, and Shari's give a portion of sales to schools, just for shopping there. Pam will look into how this works and how to get Evergreen signed up.
2. Selling script for stores – Deda & Tara will look into this idea
3. Corn maze at Lakeview Farms – Vici said the owner is willing to do an Evergreen night where we would get \$1 from each ticket sold on a particular night. It was decided to not do it this year, because of the short notice and Skateworld is this month, too. Keep in mind for next year.
4. Cookie dough sale will begin Nov. 2

### **Student Store – Chris**

BOSS Bucks were a problem the first day the store was open – kids were trying to use last year’s BOSS Bucks. We’re only accepting the yellow/gold colored ones right now. By Thursday and Friday they had it figured out.

The idea of a cart going around the lunch benches selling certain items was discussed. It would mean a 3<sup>rd</sup> person would be needed. We’ll try it the first week of Nov and then evaluate at the next meeting.

### **Principal’s Report - Rian**

1. Staff Development – The teachers meet 1.5 hours every other week to learn and improve their teaching. They’ve been learning techniques from the book “Teach Like a Champion.”
2. Academic interventions – the Americorps teachers is starting a math club after school on Mondays and Wednesdays. Kids can come and get extra help with math. Tuesdays and Thursdays is a general homework club – a quiet place to work on homework and get help if needed.
3. Engaging students in school – Mr. Petrick and Mrs. Harrington spend time in the classrooms every week. They have been looking for the “engaged classroom of the week.” Kids have been learning what an engaged student looks like/acts like and will be rewarded for doing it. They pick 2 classrooms each week – the teacher and class get a certificate and the kids get an Evergreen pencil and lanyard.
4. There are many after school clubs in the works – a modern graphic t- shirt club, a juggling club, HEY club, photography class, chess & strategy game class, Glencoe youth dance, total body conditioning
5. Literary Chills – Mr. Knox and Mr. Fishback will be putting together this evening where kids will present their writing. Oct 27, 6:30pm
6. This is anti-bullying month – they have a cyber bullying lesson in guide room this week. Red Ribbon week – last week of Oct. There will be an assembly for the whole school by the Center for Prevention of Hate and Violence. The focus will be on tolerance for different groups/types of people.
7. Conferences – next week – Thursday, Oct. 20, 5:00pm-8:00pm and Friday, Oct 21, 8:00am-11:30am

Parent club will be providing dinner for the teachers and staff on the evening of conferences, Oct 20. Dinner will be ready to be served by 4:00pm. A sign-up sheet went around the room to bring items and Anita will distribute the sign up list via email.

## Evergreen Parent Club Meeting Minutes – November 14, 2011

### Secretary's Report – Anita

- A parent has requested evening meetings. The idea was discussed and tabled for now. Our meetings for the year have been scheduled, and coincide with the staff lunches. The minutes will be posted on the website and emailed.

### Treasurer's Report – Chitra

- The student store was not open one day in October when it was scheduled to be open, and 2 days so far in November. Vici is trying to put a sub list together. It will be the volunteer's responsibility to find a sub if she cannot make it on the day she signed up. The store brought in \$426 in October.
- Cookie Dough sales - \$1600 after the first turn in day. That equals \$800 for parent club.
- I Love My School – we need to be registered with Intel and Nike to get the matching funds. There is a long list of other companies that offer matching funds. It would be best to have a space on the donation form where parents can indicate which company they work for that will offer matching funds.

### Principal's Report – Rian

- 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter starts today
- Behavior data – trackers/referrals/suspensions – this year so far Evergreen has half of what it was last year at this time. Very low also compared to other middle schools in Hillsboro.
- Bombastic Bash – 97% of the kids qualify to attend this event on Friday afternoon. There will be a dance, games, basketball, and other activities available.
- Enrichments after school with the Zone – looking at a robotic club and gamemaker for spring. If you have a new club idea, find 5-8 kids who are interested and a staff advisor (actually, the advisor doesn't need to be a teacher, can be a parent or community member)
- The district is looking closely at secondary scheduling, possibly to make changes to save money. Block scheduling at the high school is more expensive. They will be looking at going to a regular 45-50 minute class time with 5 classes per day. The middle school schedule could change too. These things need to be looked at because the district is facing another possible \$4-5 million cuts for the next school year (2012-13)
- Career Fair at Evergreen – Tues, Dec 13. - for 8<sup>th</sup> graders. They sign up to see speakers in 3 occupations and listen to a featured speaker in the gym. Looking for speakers interested in sharing about their job/field. Need to share with 4 groups of kids, 15 minutes each group, 8:45am-11:15am. Contact the school if interested.
- Holiday Food Baskets – Leadership runs a canned food drive encouraging students to bring in canned goods. There is a competition between classes with prizes for the class with the most donations. Parent club has budgeted \$500 to help provide food for these baskets. The baskets

go to needy families with kids who attend Evergreen. Teachers volunteer to deliver the baskets on the first Saturday of Winter Break. Anita mentioned that Fred Meyer donates goods to organizations with non-profit tax id numbers. Tara works at Fred Meyer and will look into how this works.

- 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Completion Ceremony – Will not be held at Liberty High School, as it was last year. Too expensive. Can't do it at Glencoe anymore either, because it is not a large enough space to accommodate all of the families. Will probably have to have the ceremonies at Evergreen during the school day, by team. Will form a planning committee with some staff and some parents. Chitra suggested using the auditorium at Intel. She said they have loaned it out to groups, such as the boy scouts.

#### **Store Schedule – Vici**

- Passed around the schedule for December. Contact her if you're available to be on the sub list.

**Talent Show** – Juli is working with Ms. Taylor on this event scheduled for sometime in spring.

**Concession door** – Rian said we need to find a contractor willing to donate his time and work with the facilities director. The district facilities dept. is only focusing on necessary repairs due to budget cuts. Tara's husband is a possibility. Shena & Tara will discuss it.

**I Love My School/Check writing campaign** – Jacki A. will be in charge of getting the letter and envelope out in 1<sup>st</sup> semester report card (in Feb).

**Skate Night** - This event was not well attended on Halloween night.

#### **Staff Massage day – Karen**

- Has contacted the professional masseuse to come again this winter. Karen and Rian will meet to come up with a date.

### **Treasurer's Report – Chitra**

- The Cookie dough fundraiser is done and we made \$2745.
- The Student Store has made a little money so far this year (approx. \$100). We've taken in 590 BOSS Bucks.
- Intel matching funds is all set up for the I Love My School campaign
- We have the opportunity to operate a concession stand at 4 basketball games in January. Chitra will get the exact dates. 1 game per week, 4-6pm.

### **Principal's Report – Rian**

- District online learning – at the board meeting Tuesday night they will be voting on an online learning program for middle and high school.
- Schedule changes – Rian has been attending meetings for the middle school level. They want to provide flexibility for students – allow them to take a 2<sup>nd</sup> elective or a 2<sup>nd</sup> math class. They want to be able to individualize the school experience based on the student's needs. The schedule changes will be finalized by Feb.
- HEY coalition club – 15 students led by Troy Hall – will be attending an all day summit tomorrow with other middle school kids. They will be conducting a student survey to gather data about drug and alcohol use. Then they will use this data to help them determine what to target when they get their message out to the students.
- Adalante Chicas – club for Latinas – 25 Evergreen girls are involved. They meet once a week after school. There is a staff member who runs the club with a set curriculum. They took a field trip to PSU and had a Family night last Friday.
- Web design class – after school – an Intel parent has been teaching it.
- Tag lunches – Another Intel parent running these
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade completion planning team – Will have the ceremony during the day this year. 1<sup>st</sup> meeting in January after school. Anita & Juli volunteered to be the parent participants on the team.

**Talent Show - Juli**

- Date is set – March 8, 2012
- Will have student art display and staff/student Basketball game, as in the past
- Tryouts for the talent show will be Feb 22, 23, 24 at lunch time. Parents needed to help with this.
- Rian will do a dance again.

## Evergreen Parent Club Meeting Minutes – February 13, 2012

### Secretary's Report – Anita

- Anita made a coupon for a free Evergreen lanyard, which the counselors will offer to new students enrolling in the middle of the school year. This will give them a little welcome gift from the Parent Club and also get them to come to the store. A sample coupon is in the store.
- 8<sup>th</sup> grade completion ceremony – The committee met in January. Anita and Juli were the parent reps. Two ceremonies will be held in June at Evergreen. Pathfinders will be June 11 at 2:00pm and Explorers will be June 12 at 2:00pm. The committee thought it would be nice if Parent Club were to serve cake after each ceremony in the commons. Anita looked into the cost – Winco was the cheapest. 12 full sheet cakes = \$443.76. Currently, our budget line item for 8<sup>th</sup> grade party is \$2000. This encompasses paying for the inflatables on the last day of school and an 8<sup>th</sup> grade celebration. The last day of school inflatables cost is \$1650. And the cake will be almost \$500 (figuring in plates, forks, napkins, drinks, etc.) A motion was made to up the budget amount for this line item to \$2200. The motion was approved.

### Treasurer's Report – Chitra

- Student store has turned a profit of \$500 so far this year.
- Shena received a thank you letter from Mr. Kivett for speakers. However, we don't remember providing speakers to the PE department. Rian said he had paid for it out of other funds.
- Cookie dough – received another \$185. Shena explained that this money was what we didn't spend on promotion in terms of prizes, etc.

### Student Store - Chris

- Chris asked for a debit card for store purchasing, but instead was able to work out a payment system to where Chitra will get her a reimbursement check sooner.

### Fundraising – Shena

- Shena has applied for a grant with the Hillsboro Schools Foundation for \$8,000. She has asked for money to re- vamp the student store, including adding a concession door.
- Coupon Book – Teachers will send home the information with students on March 6. Turn-in days will be March 13 & 20, 8:15am-8:45am

### Teacher Massage Day – Karen L.

- 60-70 staff members signed up for massages at the end of January
- 2 certified masseuses gave massages
- They donated their time, but Karen bought them each a \$50 gift card as a thank you. She asked to be reimbursed by the Parent Club. We approved, and upped the staff appreciation budget to \$600.

### **Principal's Report – Rian**

- The kids will be learning about internet safety in guide room this week.
- Leadership is working on an anti-bullying campaign.
- Hey! club is working on an anti-drug campaign. They would like to make a presentation at our April meeting. They are also making a video message for 6<sup>th</sup> graders at our feeder schools.
- Talent show – Mr. Petrick has chosen 5 songs as options to dance to. The kids will get to vote on the one they want to see.
- Gym project – we received a donation from the University of Oregon – green wall padding for the gym. By the end of the school year, we'd like to repaint the inside of the gym and install the padding.
- Water reservoir project – City of Hillsboro will be creating a water reservoir across the street from the school. Kids will be involved in the project with field trips and learning opportunities beginning next fall, for 2 years.
- Glencoe forecasting for 8<sup>th</sup> graders will be the last week of Feb in science classes. There will be a showcase next Friday of elective classes and clubs.
- Schedules – High schools will be on the same schedule beginning next school year (semester, A/B block schedule). Middle school will be on the semester schedule with either 6 or 7 classes per day.
- Online school will begin in the fall. Mrs. Harrington is working ½ time now to get that up and running. There are 200+ students in Hillsboro who are homeschooled or doing online classes already. HSD wants to offer this option. It will begin on a small scale with a couple of teachers as online instructors.

### **Hillsboro Schools Foundation Auction**

- Parent club has been asked to donate a basket. Patsy, who works for Starbucks, will donate Starbucks items. Shena will put it together into a basket.

### **Basketball Concessions**

- Begins this week – games are: Feb 15, Feb 16, Feb 23, and Feb 27 from 4-5:30
- Get there at 3:00 to be ready to sell by 3:45.
- Get cash box from Kelly in the office. Lock it into the student store afterwards.

### **Talent Show - Juli**

- Auditions will be Feb 21 & 23 at both lunches.
- Concession stand – PBIS wants to do it this year to raise money.

### **Concession door**

Last year the parent club was trying to raise money to put in a roll-up concession door on the side of the student store. At the time, we had a quote that it would cost \$2000. Shena thought that parent club had earmarked \$800 for this project in last year's budget. No one at the meeting knew for sure. Chitra & Anita will look into it.

### Secretary's Report – Anita

The suggestion was made to involve leadership with selling items from the cart. Rian did not think it was a good idea to have the kids in charge of the money and inventory.

### Concession Door – Shena

- Cost is \$3000 – we have \$2000 so far (\$1250 was raised last year at the lottery scratch off event and parent club earmarked another \$750 for this project). Rian needs to talk with the contractor. By the next meeting we will know how the coupon book sales did and we'll have a complete estimate for the door. Then we'll be able to vote on whether or not we can afford to pay for the door.

### Principal's Report – Rian

- On April 12 at 7pm Rian will hold a community session about the 2012-13 Hillsboro School district budget and the shortfall of \$7.65 million. Rian presented part of the powerpoint presentation for that evening .

### Latinos Parent Outreach night

Adelante Chicas organization will have 4 parent nights in April. Chris Johnson is the teacher organizing this . Adam will find out from her if she needs Parent Club to do anything in terms of refreshments, etc.

**Americorp Volunteer Project – Adam**

Adam is coordinating volunteers to help with painting the gym on April 21 from 9am-12pm. Parents are needed to help with this project. Adam will contact Anita with the details.
