## The Crimson Tide Is All In When Serving Others

As we kick into high in 2012 it is a good time to use a strategic time out and revisit some of the good work that good young men and women are doing for others. The wise old saying that “those who have much... much is expected” is played out daily on the Tide campus. The Crimson Tide is very active in the local community and giving back from the abundance they have been given.

**The ASB Leadership**, lead by **President Cecilee Russell**, raised 25,741 cans of food for the local Elks food drive. This effort will provide some much needed relief to local families. One of the benefits of the can food drive was an all school assembly which featured a student standing ovation for “The Men of Glencoe.” You can search the title on Youtube.com for a look at the skit that brought the entire school to its feet.

**The Glencoe Sparrow Club** has logged over 1,300 hours of documented community service and raised \$14,500 in the race to raise the needed \$23,000 for alumni **Carlos Aguilar’s** kidney transplant. Our hats are off to our friends at **Evergreen Middle School** who pitched in over \$850 to save Carlos who is 19 years old and undergoing dialysis three times per week. **The GHS Math Center** has been busy as eight student tutors have recorded 80 hours of peer tutoring. These student volunteers recognize the importance of peer achievement and have added to the success of the Math Lab and Math Center under the direction of AmeriCorps leader **Sarah Bidwell**. The GHS students who have been tutoring peers are **Hampus Hammarlund, Brec Kaysen, Feng Yan Zhen, Allison Stadelman, Duyan Zhen, Sierra Harris, Juana Vasquez, and Leticia Saiz.**

**Glencoe High School Biology** students, with guidance and training from SOLV representatives, are steadily restoring the watershed known as McKay Creek. September of 2011 saw the removal of huge swaths of invasive Armenian Blackberry, followed in October and November by the planting of native Dogwood, Alder and Willow trees. The students bioengineered the slope nearest the track with cottonwood stakes, along with straw and native grass seed to prevent erosion. Already the watershed is much healthier and more beautiful, as a significant amount of trash and

All in all, the Tide student body has reinvested themselves into the community that invests so much in them. There are many more projects and volunteers involved but the above list gives us a picture of the quality of student our community is raising. ## **STUDENTS IN SCIENCE**

Glencoe students Tadvana Canakapalli, Subret Aryal, Megan Nishida and Tommy Nuthmann traveled with physics and astronomy teacher John Gibbs to Austin, Texas to present their research at the American Astronomical Society's winter conference during the week of January 8<sup>th</sup>. Since July these students have been working with students from three other high schools around the country searching for young stars using data that was collected by NASA's Spitzer Space Telescope. In addition to presenting their research, the students attended talks covering many areas of current research in astronomy and had the opportunity to meet Dr. John Mather, winner of the 2006 Nobel Prize in Physics.

## Senior Spotlight – 80 students, 1 original composition, 13 short plays, 2 unique shows

Glencoe High School is proud to bring you the biggest Senior Spotlight yet! Two completely different shows are being presented in repertory February 22<sup>nd</sup> through the 25<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 p.m. The Wednesday and Friday show features six short plays and one original music composition. The Thursday and Saturday show features seven short plays. All of the plays are directed and co-directed by 16 of Glencoe's seniors, and the original composition is written by Adam Heyen, a Glencoe senior as well. The 50 actors include students from 9<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade, and it is a wonderful opportunity for many of the 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders to perform on Glencoe's stage for the first time.

**Original works shine in these performances.** Eight of the thirteen plays are written by Glencoe's directing seniors, including Rebecca Baugh, Jake Malstrom, Nicole Kulick and Matt Kishlock, Xander Henry and Elise Hampton, Miranda Leyson, Isaiah Bradley, Samantha Matsumoto, and Larissa Vanderwall. Other directors and co-directors include Alex Lyman, Alicia Gomness, Sean Clendenon, Anni Reilly, Leah Burcham, and Chelsea Gritz.

The production is also supported by 10 technical crew members and several musicians.

The most exciting aspect of Senior Spotlight is that students really run the show. They get the experience of selecting or writing shows and music, casting and selecting musicians, and directing shows and music. **Then these students get to show their vision to friends, family, and community members** on these four special nights.

The Glencoe community should be very proud of the work of their students and what they can accomplish. We hope you will come to one or both of the shows. **Admission is FREE**, but donations to Glencoe Theatre are always gratefully accepted. Doors open at 7:00 p.m. for a 7:30 p.m. show, and we hope to see you there!
