As a member of the Hillsboro community, I strongly urge you to support the following:

- K-12 Education Funding of \$9.462 Billion or higher for the 2019-21 biennium with no strings attached
 - o At **\$8.87 Billion**, the Hillsboro School District will experience a shortfall of \$20.86 million
 - At \$8.972 Billion, the Hillsboro School District will experience a shortfall of \$17.3 million
 - At \$9.462 Billion, the Hillsboro School District can meet current service level, but cannot lower class sizes or make other investments in student success
 - Hillsboro School District has reduced \$63.93 million from its General Fund budget since 2008-09 versus what would have maintained a current service level
 - A kindergartner who started in 2008-09 has lost 18 instructional days due to budget reductions; if you also consider that our school year is 5 days shorter than the national average of 180 instructional days (5.5 days shorter at the elementary level), by the time that student graduates, they will have lost another 68.5 days for a total of 86.5 days, or more than 4 months of school
- Active and collaborative efforts to enact revenue reform and contain costs
- No new mandates unless they are research-based, proven to be effective, and come with their own funding source
- Full funding of Measure 98 in a manner that does not reduce the State School Fund allocation
