GUIDELINES

STEP 1: PRE-ASSESSMENTS TO DETERMINE LEVEL AND RATE OF LEARNING

The following assessments will be used to determine level and rate of learning:

- State Assessment Data: OAKS test scores from 7th grade benchmark
- District Assessment Data: EasyCBM, Oral Reading Fluency, DCA
- Writing pre-assessment given in September
- Per unit, monitor of daily work and achievement for rate of learning to be about right
- Vocabulary pre-assessment and formative assessment data for both academic vocabulary and Greek
 Latin Root Words as taught throughout the year

STEP II: **DIFFERENTIATION** OPTIONS

Describe what differentiation options are available, and how differentiation will take place, in this course.

- Students will have the opportunity to choose tiered options for summative projects (such as following a novel or an author study). Choices will be required in higher-order thinking levels.
- Students will have the opportunity for assignment and assessment differentiation (such as a move from 'define and use' vocabulary to 'analyze' word relationships through analogies).
- Students will have the opportunity for enrichment (such as topic variation during research)
- Students will have the opportunity to show their knowledge beyond the "average" on rubrics/scoring guides.
- Students will be expected to perform at 90% or higher on summative assignments.
- Students will have the opportunity to choose alternative texts.

STEP III: POST-ASSESSMENTS

Align with State and District requirements.

- Unit tests (such as reading comprehension, vocabulary, including both short constructed and extended response)
- Unit MYP Projects
- Work sample (such as an essay)
- State Test
