This picture is too blurry.

FOCUSing seems simple however can be difficult. Make sure that your subject is clear and in FOCUS. Don't forget it's alright if the background is a little blurry, as long as the subject is clear.

A well FOCUSed picture can mean the difference between a great picture and one that's just alright.



This is the same picture and it is much better, since it is clear and in FOCUS.

# Head Room

A picture of someone can seem like an easy shot. Many times people will leave too much or too little HEAD ROOM in a photo.

HEAD ROOM is a very common mistake people make when taking pictures.





This picture is evenly spaced all the way across. Her head is not too low or too high on the screen.
Watch out for too much HEAD ROOM in your photographs.

Too much HEAD ROOM is above her head and how it can take away from the picture.

### Lead Space

LEAD SPACE is when your subject is walking or looking somewhere be sure to capture the direction they're looking, not what is behind or to the side of them.


See how you can't see what she is walking towards. This can be confusing to people looking at this photo when there is no LEAD SPACE

Now in this picture you can clearly see the LEAD SPACE in front of her.





LIGHTING is one of the most important aspects of photography. The amount and direction of LIGHT can change your entire photograph.





Make sure the LIGHT source is in front of the subject.

This is caused by too much light behind the subject, which blacks her out.

## Playsround



See how the sunLIGHT behind the subject makes her dark.

In this photo the LIGHT is not behind her which makes for a brighter picture.



Since students are active during recess, two other important issues are FOCUSing and a DISTRACTING BACKGROUND.

Revisit these slides if you are having trouble.

ARY SCHOOL

LIGHTING is the main issue on the playground. Make sure the sunLIGHT isn't directly behind the subject.

## Distracting Background

DISTRACTING BACKGROUND can ruin a great picture. If too much action is occurring in the background, then the picture can be confusing.





Now in this picture you can clearly see the subject.

Make sure that the subject of the photo is the focus of the picture not the BACKGROUND.

See how the kids playing in the background are DISTRACTING.





The picture below is much better than the first one. You can clearly see the subject and don't have to look for him.



ZOOM is important in photography. You can see how the picture above is too far away and he is not the main focus of the shot.

CAREFUL: When you zo

When you zoom it is important to hold the camera VERY steady.


## Rule of Thirds



This red circle shows how the subject is right in the middle of the screen.

Orenco's sign above is in the CENTER.....sometimes a neat effect can be placing the subject of the photo OFF CENTER of the screen by using the RULE OF THIRDS.

The RULE OF THIRDS effect can make a good picture look GREAT as long as the subject of the photo is still the main object that catches your eyes.



The green circles represent areas the subject should be centered on when using the RULE OF THIRDS.

# Line Line

See how this picture uses LEADING LINE to give you an angle you normally would not see. LEADING LINEs are all around us.



LEADING LINE is a cool effect that can be used by finding a natural line and following it all the way to the end from a low angle.


