

Standard Diploma

Standard Diplomas Require **24 Credits** to Graduate and must include:

Chancellor's Diploma

Chancellor's Diplomas Require **26 Credits** to Graduate and must include:

Chancellor's Diploma

Students completing a Chancellor's Diploma must also:

- Have a 3.0 cumulative GPA
- Have a 3.0 GPA in academic courses
- Have a C or higher in all academic courses
- Complete a minimum of 4.0 credits of IB or Dual Credit coursework

Modified Diploma

Standard Diplomas Require 24 Credits to Graduate and must include:

A Modified Diploma is not something that you opt-into yourself. If you have not discussed this diploma option with your counselor or case manager, it likely **does not apply** to you.

Be ready. Like, really ready.

- Not only do you want to meet admission requirements for the pathway you're preparing for, but you also want to be competitive against other applicants
 - This applies to everyone, regardless of your future path!
 - Extra core courses, courses of rigor, CCP courses, etc... will help you with this
- Also, if you're college bound, taking additional core & IB classes will prepare you for success when it comes to college-level content and expectations

This is a Planning Tool

- Remember: this is a **TOOL**
 - This is not permanent & is not tied to forecasting
 - By completing this now, you're giving yourself time to consider your options *before* you forecast
- Don't stress!
 - Just plan, rearrange, and open your mind!

Disclaimer: there's no guarantee that every course will be offered every year. It's good to have some backup plans ready just in case!

Dual Language Notice

Option 1: **IB DL Spanish (A) Language & Literature SL1**

This is the most demanding option and a continuation of Language Arts from 10th grade. Students receive LA credit towards graduation. Normally, this option is only available to DL students and, in very special circumstances, some non-DL students.

Option 2: **IB DL Spanish (B) Language HL1**

This is a slightly different option and not a continuation of Language Arts from prior courses either in Spanish or in English. Students receive WL credit towards graduation. This option is available to DL students (the vast majority of students in that course) and non-DL students (provided that have taken Spanish 3 or meet some proficiency level to be in the class). Students taking this option must register also in a Language Arts course to meet LA graduation requirements.

Additional Social Science classes can be taken by students for elective credit (ex: AP Psychology, AP Euro, Psychology, Sociology, Ethnic Studies, Civics & Community Service 1&2)

Additional Core

- **For Chancellor's Diploma only**
- One additional credit of **either** Science **or** Social Science is required at any grade level
 - Make a note on your four year planner of what course you plan to take and when

Important Reminders

- **If you want to compete for the school:**

You need to be passing minimum of **five** classes

- This means if you are in a sport or other competing extracurricular (band, choir, etc...), you need to be enrolled in at LEAST five classes to be eligible to compete

- **Eight credits a year** is our maximum.

- You cannot have more than 8.0 credits per year

Career & College Pathways

- CCPs aim to help you explore and/or better prepare you for your chosen career path while you're in high school
 - You can take courses tied to a career or industry
 - Your senior project is built-in to the senior level CCP class (Capstone course)
 - You'll get real world internship experience
 - It'll help you develop work skills that can be applied to any industry

Career & College Pathways

- If you are unsure what CCP is the right fit for you, consider:
 - What are your career interests? What field do you want to pursue?
 - What courses or elective are you interested in?
 - What are your strengths or skills?
 - What jobs sound interesting to you?

CCP Electives

- Use the CCP One-Pagers to find electives you've already taken, are planning to take, or are interested in taking
 - Do your electives fall under one or more CCP? If so, consider continuing with that CCP!
 - Think about the course pathways for CCP electives
- It's common for students to take classes that fall under multiple CCPs, and that's great!
 - This helps you to explore
 - You can continue taking classes for more than one



Elective Credits

Elective Credits

Be aware that you need:

- **3.0 credits of Applied Arts/World Language/CTE Credits**
 - Most CCP courses fall into this category
- **5.0 credits of any kind of electives**
 - Support classes (AVID, ELL, Math/English Support...)
 - Electives not from a CCP (Team sports, TA, etc...)
- You're not required to take a **World Language at HHS**

Consider your Overall Load

- Look at each grade level one at a time
 - Is your course load too light or too heavy?
- Remember :
 - It will be difficult to switch out of classes that you forecast for
 - Especially IB classes
- Consider how much work your course load will give you
 - Don't put too much on your plate if it will be difficult to maintain
 - Make sure you are adequately challenged!

Have any remaining spaces?

- With whatever room you have leftover for each grade, fill in other electives so that each grade totals up to 8.0 credits.
 - Use the general electives section on the forecasting sheet OR the CCP one-pagers for ideas
 - Examples: AVID, Seminary, Support Classes for IEP or ELL, etc...
